
OUR VISION

Unique Get Together Society has grown to a staff of 59. All who come with their own strengths and passion to help others.

This includes an incredible support staff for group homes for at risk youth in the Fraser Valley and Coquitlam. We have succeeded in gaining the trust of these youth, who, in our care, have learnt how to cope and communicate without conflict. Our staff have been able to share their wisdom and create a safe and stable space for them to heal from their traumas. These homes run double staffed at all times, with a team of house managers on rotation, available 24 hours a day in case of incident.


This year we have expanded our reach into beautiful Kamloops, led by our founder, Debra Abraham. There, she is developing support programs, and creating an extension of all things UGTS. In an effort to highlight and create an inclusive environment, we have connected with several local BIPOC organizations, and recently we hosted two Indigenous led culture camps with support of the Kamloops Indian Band.

We also took part in a multi-cultural event in Kamloops: The Tapestry Festival, to connect with the community! In addition to these events, we have also hosted a Black History Month events, attended job fairs and fundraised at KMS Tools and hosted our Walk for Trauma.

In Chilliwack and Vancouver, our Spring and Summer Camps have been successful! At full capacity our kids enjoyed fun filled days, which included swimming and on the land activities.

On April 1st, we expanded our Food Hamper Program to the Chilliwack area. We opened registration in the last week of March with a launch of the first delivery on April 1st. In the fist week of opening registration, we had an overwhelming response to the program and registered 124 families, which equates to approximately 375 individuals. Ages ranging from infant to the elderly. Currently between Vancouver and Chilliwack, we are serving approximately 500 clients through this program.

Our on-going support programs are running successfully with leadership from our programs manager Marina Garmon and our director of operations, Kelsey McGregor.

HEALTH & WELLNESS

Although our primary goal is to help marginalized and underserved families, we also strive to create an inspiring, safe and stable workplace.

In a time where health and wellness are at the forefront of most people's lives, we have developed many resources this year for our staff to utilize if ever they feel they need the extra support.

In addition to having more management staff, we have added 5 IFOT (Indigenous Focus Oriented Therapy) sessions for every employee. Our two wonderful IFOT therapists, Sabina Galay and Jennifer Apedaile, on our team are available to all staff at anytime.

We have built an HR department that is in the works of growing. Developing protocols and resources that staff will have full access to as daily guides. As living documents, our staff are welcome to share their input for the success of the organization. The opinions of our front liners is what will keep these documents current and relevant.

This year, with restrictions softening, we were able to host our in-person staff retreat at the beautiful Trout Lake Community Center. Here we were able to reconnect with colleagues in person, and learn different coping mechanisms led by yoga instructor Farah Nazarali. The change in scenery, and opportunity to voice our opinions and struggles in a safe space was a positive experience for all.





Other Expenses	136,518.78	173,936.00		From 2021 to 2022, the increase in business operations was the primary contributor to the 20% rise in other expenses.



We have received \$481,893.91 out of which 47% have been spent towards the project.




The total Project cost estimate submitted was 1,050,000.00 out of which 22% we have spent.



As the organization grows, UGTS has some very exciting projects in the works!
All programs will be ongoing, and open for registrations, while we continue to grow
and expand our reach into more and more communities.

UGTS DAYCARE

Unique Get Together Society will be adding 36 daycare spaces in Chilliwack with \$1.2-million provincial grant. It's one of the first "state-of-the-art, 21st century" childcare centres in the province that will incorporate yoga and daily meditation with the kids, plus welcome elders and grandparents as part of the program.

Construction is well underway! We are set to open our doors in January of 2023!

All Nations Healing House Treatment Center

This year, with expansion in Kamloops, we have found an opportunity to build an all-inclusive drug and addiction healing house. This house will incorporate be Indigenous led, with traditional medicines and practices based on the seven grandfathers teachings, as well as 12 step programs. The house will be staffed with medical professionals, elders and resource workers.

We will be fundraising for the Treatment Center in December 2022! Join us for this noble cause, helping diffuse the overdose crisis one recovery at a time.
